FROM WHEELS, November 1970



The Torana GTR XU-1 is the clincher. As I predicted, the car has proved an outright contender and is now regarded as the top series production car for the 1970-71 season (just one second behind the GTHO's outright record at Warwick Farm). For GM-H it represents a brilliant marketing attack on Bathurst since the General caught almost everyone off guard. As Al Turner said at Sandown Park, "This David and Goliath bit has gone a bit too far."

As the only authority to recognise the Torana's outright potential, Wheels must claim due credit. But the General is still being very cagey and "official" comment from any GM-H employee, even after Sandown, was affected disbelief that the product could be regarded as an outright missile. I give the Oscar awards of the year to The General and his supporting cast of employees, Firth, Bond etc for their exercise in understatement acting.

But behind the facade they've built for the car as a class winner, GM-H has engaged in some serious development. As expected, the cars performed reliably at Sandown with fantastic braking and no engine problems, but some understeer drama. Getting within two seconds a lap of most of the big GTHOs (four seconds behind Moffat) on power-Sandown wasn't good enough, and The General has installed a new 20 bhp-gain camshaft for Bathurst to ensure the power difference is minimal. Now that doesn't really sound like the policy of a company that's only out for a class win, does it?

FROM WHEELS, November 1970

The Torana's gains all go back to its diminutive size. It is light and easy to drive, unlike the Falcons and Pacers which require sheer brute strength for good fast lapping. It has no great problems like the other cars – tyre wear is minimal, and brake wear is non-existent – and these two problems really bug the bigger cars. Fuel consumption could be the real turning point. The Falcons got down to 6 mph for Sandown, while the Toranas lapped competitively at 10-11 mph – so the Torana's tank size is effectively the same as the Falcons without the attendant problems of time to fuel, fuel surge, and effect on handling. The Pacers with 30 gallon tanks were down as low as 8 mpg.

The successful Torana driven to victory by Bond at Warwick Farm was tuned by Ted Munnings, of Brookvale, Sydney, an engine-genius who has been on the edge of the sport for years, and has deserved some official recognition of his work. At Sandown, the Toranas missed out on a dyno tune because of preparation time, but Munnings will almost certainly tune the Bathurst cars for Firth, and they will be top goers – especially with 180 bhp from the new camshafts.

But on the road, the Toranas are a different story. Our test car was equipped with B70-H13 Dunlop Sovereign rubber which I immediately reduced from 34-32 psi tyre pressure to 20-18 (front to rear) for an extended open road test. Over 800 miles of fast work there was no sign of tyre scrub, edging or sidewall distortion, but the ride was still unbearable. This is the real reminder of the car's design intent – as a genuine racebred machine. The ride is greatly improved on the regular GTR which suffered acute short-wheelbase pitch sensation, but the rear of the XU-1 is still so rigid it over-reacts to every road bump. Cruised between Goulburn and Canberra on the shocking Federal Highway, our crew spent a great deal of time ducking our heads from the roof – at speeds greatly reduced from those we are accustomed to on a well-sprung car.

Most XU-1 owners we have talked to don't seem to mind, and most use higher tyre pressures, but Wheels still feels there is room for considerable rear end improvement – longer springs and better damping is possible, and should be incorporated.

FROM WHEELS, November 1970

The XU-1 could also do with some basic cockpit improvements. The steering wheel could be changed for a thicker more suitable unit without greatly affecting the cost structure, but other changes would toss the XU-1 out of its current price category. Seating is top priority – at the moment the spring rates seem to be perfectly harmonised with the actual spring travel on the road wheels, multiplying the pitching effect. They are also inadequately padded and upholstered and should have at least some rake adjustments as standard equipment.

Instrumentation is perfect, and switchgear is good, but that floor dipswitch should also go – it just isn't good enough for such a high performance vehicle (the same applies to the other two cars as well).

The performance charts tell a graphic story about engine behaviour, but they are inconclusive in an analytical sense. For example, fuel consumption for overall test on the three was 10 mpg (Falcon), 14 mpg (Pacer) ad 17 mpg (Torana GTR XU-1). The Pacer also put down 15.6 second quarters under one favourable set of conditions and time forced us to put down the Torana's time on a damp track. We know a GTHO has done 13.9 on a dragstrip but 14.2 was our figure.

The real equaliser is Bathurst, and we've yet to see three-abreast first across the line there.



The plate search feature is also cool if you have a LH/X or UC. All you do is type in your VIN number and it breaks it down and gives the following information.



Sadlon is the basic upholstery material. On Torana 'S' and Brabham, it combines with new, soft, semi-perforated Griffin Grain in any of the four basic colours.

On the 'SL' a third, even more luxurious Wyvern grain combination is regular equipment. And Castillon Weave is the nylon fabric custom feature.
